MARSUE TRANSPORT BENCUBBIN 400 SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

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1. TITLE AND EVENT

The event will be known as the 2017 Marsue Transport Bencubbin 400 and will be a state championship and multi club long course off road event. The event will be held at Bencubbin, 275km east of Perth, Western Australia, on Saturday 3 and Sunday 4 June 2017.

The event will be:

- Round three of the 2017 CAMS, Carnarvon Motel, Western Australian Off Road Championship
- Round two of the 2017 WAORRA Club Championship Series.

2. AUTHORITY AND PERMIT

8. ENTRY DETAILS

Entries open upon publication of these Supplementary Regulations and close at 5:00pm on Friday 26 May 2017. Entries are limited to 70 and acceptance will be determined in order of receipt. The organisers reserve the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the event if less than 25 entries are received by the closing date.

8.1 Eligible entries

All entries must be made online at www.myraceresult.com.au and be accompanied with the specified entry fee (see Article 8.2).

8.2 Payment

The entry fee for State Championship entrants will be \$350 and the entry fee for Multi-Club entrants will be \$250. Transponder hire fee will be \$35. Payments can be made by:

10. VENUE

10.1 Camping and amenities

Camping and amenities will be available at the Bencubbin Oval from Friday 2 June 2017.

The following conditions will apply to the entire competition venue:

- No individual camp fires will be permitted - the Shire of Mt Marshall may provide a communal camp fire for patrons
- No dogs or firearms will be permitted (property owner/s exempted)
- No motorcycles, trikes or quads will be permitted (property owner/s and designated officials may be exempted at the discretion of the organisers)
- No vehicles will be permitted to be driven on the oval
- A noise curfew will apply from 11:00pm Friday and Saturday nights.

Breaches of these conditions will make the responsible crew liable to penalties as decided by the stewards of the event.

11. ELIGIBLE VEHICLES AND LICENSING

The event is open to off road vehicles in accordance with Article 4 - Vehicles of the [CAMS 2017 Off Road Standing Regulations](#).

Minimum license requirements for this event are:

- Current CAMS affiliated club membership
- Current CAMS NO, NON, NOJ, NONSE or higher competitor license
- Civil drivers license if required
- CAMS vehicle logbook.

All licenses must be presented at documentation (see Article 12.2).

11.1 WAORC signage

In accordance with Articles 2.2 and 9 of the [WAORC 2017 Sporting Regulations](#), WAORC sponsorship stickers will be required to be placed on all competing vehicles. Any vehicle that does not display sponsorship signage will not be deemed eligible for WAORC Championship Points.

12. SCRUTINY AND DOCUMENTATION

12.1 Times and venues

Scrutiny and documentation will be conducted behind the event headquarters at:

- 4:00pm to 7:00pm on Friday 2 June 2017
- 7:30am to 9:30am on Saturday 3 June 2017.

The following conditions must be met during scrutiny:

- Both driver and navigator must be present
- Vehicles and all race apparel must be presented for examination
- Vehicles must be capable of being driven in and out of the scrutiny area
- The consumption of alcohol by competitors is prohibited.

12.2 Documentation

Competitors will be required to present the following documentation prior to presenting their vehicle for scrutiny:

- Current CAMS affiliated club membership
- Current CAMS NO, NON, NOJ, NONSE or higher competitor license
- CAMS vehicle logbook
- Civil driving licenses
- Competitor licenses (if not the driver).

All pit crew and officials will be required to sign on and receive passes during documentation. Late requests for pit crew and officials' passes will not be accepted.

12.3 Guide to competitors

A guide to competitors will be issued. This guide will contain information that does not form part of these supplementary regulations, but will be of assistance to competitors, crews and spectators. The contents of the guide are for information only and may not be used as the basis of a protest.

12.4 Passes

Passes will be issued to all competitors, officials and nominated crew members. Passes will allow admittance to the pit area (see Article 17.2) and must be worn visibly at all times.

13. COMPETITOR AND OFFICIALS' BRIEFINGS

13.1 Officials' briefings

Briefings for officials will be conducted at the event headquarters at the following times:

14. RECONNAISSANCE

Competitors will complete a reconnaissance lap to familiarize themselves with the course. It will commence at **8:30am** on Saturday 3 June 2017 and consist of 1 lap of the main course. No vehicles will be permitted to commence reconnaissance of the main course after **9:15am**.

Reconnaissance of the prologue course will commence at **9:45am** on Saturday 3 June 2017. No vehicles will be permitted to commence reconnaissance of the prologue course after **10:30am**.

The following conditions will apply to reconnaissance:

- Competitors may complete reconnaissance in a four wheel drive or a competition vehicle that has passed scrutiny
- All occupants of all vehicles must wear seat belts
- The maximum speed permitted on reconnaissance is 80km/h
- Overtaking will not be permitted

Breaches of these conditions will make the responsible crew liable to penalties as decided by the stewards of the event.

15. PROLOGUE

A prologue will be held at 12:00pm on Saturday 3 June 2017 to determine starting positions for Section 1. The length of the prologue will be approximately 25km.

Competitors will start the prologue in an order determined by their position on the WAORC seeding list relative to the rest of the field. A competitor's position on the seeding list is based on their previous three prologue results. Prologue start times will be issued at documentation.

Competitors who do not finish prologue may apply to the Clerk of Course to be seeded into the field for the start of Section 1. The closing time for applications for seeding will be 1:30pm Saturday 3 June 2017.

16. STARTING AND FINISHING TIMES

Section 1 will start at **2:30pm on Saturday 3 June 2017**. Vehicles will be allowed one hour to complete this section.

Section 2 will start at **8:00am on Sunday 4 June 2017**. Vehicles will be allowed one and a half hours to complete this section.

Section 3 will commence at **11:00am on Sunday 4 June 2017**. Vehicles will be allowed five hours and forty five minutes to complete this section. Competitors will be allowed to complete two timed 20 minute pit stops during this section. Where pit stops are not taken, each competitor will have the equal amount of time, 40 minutes, added to their race time.

Competitors who do not complete the full course in each section in the prescribed time will be deemed non-finishers for that section. The Clerk of the Course has the right to stop any crew and prevent their continuation should he deem it unlikely for that crew to complete the course within the allowed time.

16.1 Starting

In Section 1, competitors will be started one at a time at one minute intervals. In Section 2, competitors will be started one at a time at one minute intervals. In Section 3, competitors will start one at a time at thirty second intervals. All intervals may vary at the discretion of the Clerk of Course.

16.2 Restarting

Competitors who do not complete a section may apply to the Clerk of the Course to start a subsequent section. If allowed to start a subsequent section, they will be required to report to the starter at their allocated time.

Cut-off times for applications to restart a section will be:

- To start Section 1 – 1:30pm Saturday 3 June 2017
- To start Section 2 – 7:00pm Saturday 3 June 2017
- To start Section 3 – 10:30am Sunday 4 June 2017.

17. PIT / PADDOCK AREA

The pit and paddock areas will, in effect, be the same area. The following conditions will apply at all times:

- No smoking, consumption or carrying of alcohol will be permitted.
- No welding, grinding or flame heating of any form will be permitted – a separate hot work area will be provided
- The maximum speed will be 5km/h
- No riding on any vehicle will be permitted unless seated in vehicle seat
- No riding on moving trailers will be permitted.

17.1 Paddock area

The paddock area will be where competing cars and support services are located during the event. It will be separate from the camping and spectator areas. Entry to the paddock will be unrestricted at any time it is not designated as being the pit area.

17.2 Pit area

The area will be designated as the pit area 30 minutes prior to the start of prologue and each section and will remain as such until an announcement is made to the contrary.

The following conditions apply to the pit area:

- The pit area will be for use by competing cars only
- Only crew members, pit crew members and officials may be admitted
- Entry will be by pit pass only
- Attire for all people will be a minimum of shoes, socks, short pants and a short-sleeved shirt
- Competitors will be responsible for ensuring their crew members are suitably attired and displaying pit passes at all times
- No spectators or children will be allowed to enter (minimum pit crew age 14 years)
- No trailers or non-race vehicles to be left in the pit area.

The restrictions on the pit and paddock areas will be lifted once the organisers have declared the end of the competition. Breaches of any of the conditions listed in Article 17 and 17.2 will make the responsible crew liable to penalties as decided by the stewards of the event.

17.3 Refuelling

All refuelling during competition is to be done only in the pit area. The following conditions will apply while refuelling:

- All fuel containers must be stored in the pit area for the duration of the event
- Cars must be refuelled with the crew out of the vehicle and the engine off
- A fire extinguisher must be held at the ready during the entire fuelling operation

- Attire for all crew involved in the refuelling operation will be a minimum of shoes and socks and non-flammable clothing from wrist to neck to ankle.

If a vehicle runs out of fuel on the course, the Clerk of Course or a nominated deputy may give written permission for that vehicle to be refuelled on the course, provided that the safety conditions listed above are met.

18. COURSE DESCRIPTION

The surface will consist of dirt, sand, gravel, clay and rocky outcrop.

18.1 Course length – State Championship entrants

The event will consist of **one lap of the Minor Course** (approximately 25km) and **five laps of the Main Course** (approximately 75km).

Section 1 will be one lap of the Minor Course. This section will have a competitive distance of approximately 25km.

Section 2 will be one lap of the Main Course. This section will have a competitive distance of approximately 75km.

Section 3 will be four laps of the Main Course. This section will have a competitive distance of approximately 300km.

State Championship entrants will be required to complete all sections. The total competitive distance for State Championship Entrants will be approximately 400km.

18.2 Course length – Multi-Club entrants

The event will consist of **one lap of the Minor Course** (approximately 25km) and **three laps of the Main Course** (approximately 75km).

Section 1 will be one lap of the Minor Course. This section will have a competitive distance of approximately 25km.

Section 2 will be one lap of the Main Course. This section will have a competitive distance of approximately 75km.

Section 3 will be two laps of the Main Course. This section will have a competitive distance of approximately 150km.

Multi Club entrants will be required to complete all sections. The total competitive distance for Multi-Club entrants will be approximately 250km.

All distances noted in these supplementary regulations are approximate, and the organisers reserve the right to change the course at any time during the event if course conditions change. All course changes will be communicated to competitors via briefings or further advice.

18.3 Course marking

In addition to standard course markers, chevrons, hydra-barriers, witches hats, bunting and crops will be used to delineate the course in some areas. These will be treated as course markers for the purpose of penalties.

18.4 Flag signals

Flag signals may be used to warn competitors of danger or other situations requiring caution.

18.5 Passage controls

Competitors must pass through, but will not be required to stop at, any passage control/SOS point unless instructed by an official, or stopping to report an incident.

18.6 Sweep vehicle

A sweep vehicle will traverse and inspect the entire course at the end of the prologue and each section, immediately after the last competing vehicle has commenced its last lap.

19. COMPETITION CONDUCT

19.1 Overtaking

The organisers view the safety implications of overtaking very seriously and offences against Article 13 of the [CAMS 2017 Off Road Standing Regulations](#) will result in penalties being imposed (see Article 20.3).

Shunting is not an acceptable method of indicating a desire to overtake. Any reports of shunting or similar behaviour are likely to result in all competitors involved being charged.

19.2 Incidents

Competitors involved in any form of accident or incident during the event must report it to the Competitor Liaison Officer, Clerk of Course or Assistant Clerk of Course and complete an [incident report form](#). This should be done as soon as possible, but in any case not later than the finish of the event.

19.3 Recovery

Vehicles that have broken down or stopped for any reason will be recovered after the completion of the relevant section. Removal from the race course or its immediate surrounds will be carried out by official vehicles only, unless written permission to remove the vehicle has been obtained by either the Clerk of Course or a nominated deputy.

19.4 Inspection of vehicles after an incident

Any vehicle that has been involved in an accident or incident, or is structurally damaged for any reason, must report to the Chief Scrutineer for inspection upon completion of the lap that the vehicle was damaged.

Damaged vehicles will not be permitted to continue in the event until repaired to the satisfaction of the Chief Scrutineer. Breaches of these conditions may result in exclusion from the event. See Article 16.2 for information about applying to restart a subsequent section.

19.5 Impound/ Parc Fermé

The organisers reserve the right to impound competing vehicles during or after the event in order to verify eligibility or for regrouping.

20. PENALTIES AND PROTESTS

20.1 CAMS penalties

The following are offences against the [CAMS 2017 Off Road Standing Regulations](#) and the specified penalties may be imposed by the stewards of the event:

20.2 WAORC penalties

20.3 Event penalties

The following are offences against these supplementary regulations and the specified penalties may be imposed by the stewards of the event:

Dislodging a course marker and reporting it*	5 minutes
Dislodging a course marker and NOT reporting it*	30 minutes
Failing to allow a faster car to overtake at the first available opportunity	1 minute
Shunting	1 minute

* Dislodged course markers must be reported to the Competitor Liaison Officer, Clerk of Course or Assistant Clerk of Course as soon as possible after completion of the relevant section.

20.4 Judges of fact

Nominated officials, including, Clerk of Course, Chief Time Keeper, Pit Officials, SOS/ Recovery and Check Point Officials and Spectator Marshalls will be deemed Judges of Fact with regards to:

- whether or not a vehicle deviates from the course
- whether a vehicle dislodges a course marker
- relative order, time of arrival and direction of entry into controls.

There is no right of protest against the decision of a Judge of Fact.

21.1 Alcohol, drugs and other substances

Any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the [CAMS Anti-Doping Policy](#) and/or the [CAMS Illicit Drugs in Sport \(IDiS\) Policy](#) as published on the CAMS website.

Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the [CAMS Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing](#).
